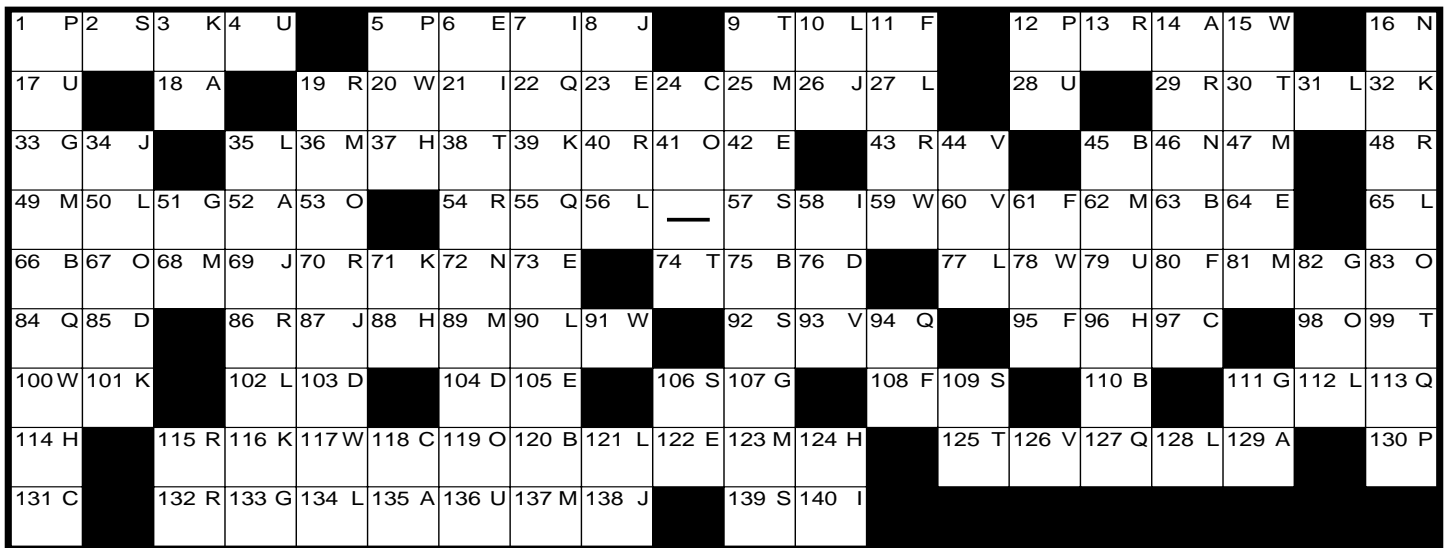


1939 - What a year for movies!
